Parish Council Updates

Charlton Village Community Association – Incorporated Charity

Your community needs you!!

On the 22nd November the community events committee met. Due to financial policy the Parish Council can no longer act as the main organiser of any event and it was decided to create an Incorporated Charitable Association (ICA). This will then become the vehicle for managing the Community Day and other events/activities. A draft constitution will be prepared as quickly as possible. The key is to get many more Charlton residents (and supporters) to join as members so that activities/events are driven by all and not just the few. If you feel you wish to be more involved then you could join as a Trustee.

The purposes of the charity will be along these lines

- (1) The support and enhancement of community life and wellbeing of all residents
- (2) The preservation of the existing and future environment of the village.

Trustees

The charity would be managed by a committee of trustees who are appointed at the Annual General Meeting (AGM) of the charity.

In order to carry out the charitable purposes, the trustees have the power to (at least):

- (1) Raise funds, receive grants and donations
- (2) Apply funds to carry out the work of the charity
- (3) Co-operate with and support other charities with similar purposes
- (4) Do anything which is lawful and necessary to achieve the purposes

Membership

The charity shall have a membership. People who support the work of the charity and are aged 18 or over, can apply to the trustees to become a member. Once accepted by the trustees, membership lasts for 3 years and may be renewed. The trustees will keep an up-to-date membership list.

Speedwatch

The police conducted Speedwatch activities in October:

- Foxcotte Road – Charlton Village – 21:20 till 22:00
- Charlton Road – Charlton Village – 22:10 till 22:30

They will carry out random checks going forward. Although only one stop was made on Foxcotte Road and words of advice were given, there is conclusive evidence that speeding remains an ongoing issue. Please drive carefully through the village

Climate Change

It's official: Charlton is not sold on the Greening Campaign. Only very few cards were displayed and so carbon counting was not possible. Feedback suggests that residents are more aware of energy usage but this is probably driven by rising costs rather than a focus on our climate emergency. It seems there is no collective desire to work together and so we would just wish you good luck with your personal journeys to better living and awareness.

Riverbank Repairs – Charlton Village

We have been trying to get a solution to the erosion of the riverbank opposite Tesco for many months/years. Every time we think we have an answer another obstacle emerges. We are in discussion with the company that recently enhanced the Carters Meadow portion of the stream and we are hopeful that a suitable and affordable scheme can be agreed. The constraint is that the stream feeds the River Anton which in turn feeds the River Test and this gets Environment Agency interest and bureaucracy. Look forward to more updates and we hope 2023 will finally be the year we get the repairs done and improve the flora and fauna in the area. In the meantime, we would welcome volunteers who are prepared to keep the area clear of rubbish and generally neat and tidy. Charlton Village Community Day 1 July 2023

It is the intention to hold our CVCD on 1 July 2023. We are hoping to create a Charitable Association (see first article) to run the event with the Parish Council and Church fully supporting. The next meeting is proposed for 24th Jan 2023

Railings by Carters Meadow

The Parish Council recently had a meeting with Carters Meadow and it was agreed that a gate would be installed into the railings (marked red). This would enable Charlton residents to access the Open Green space and enjoy the tranquility of the river.

Hurstbourne Forge has been given the contract to create a gate. To do this they will cut and remove the existing railing and create the gate at their workshop.

This will mean that for a short period of time there will be a gap, although the railing by the bridge will still be intact and therefore it should not create a health and safety issue.

Jubilee Beacon

The Parish Council is seeking permission to place the Jubilee Beacon in the village. An early response from TVBC questioned the 'materials, size and prominence of the Beacon' but it is meant to be prominent, admired and a lasting memorial in Charlton Village. The map shows the initial 4 locations all of which would need to be checked for subterranean pipes, wires etc.



Responses have been very positive about locating the Beacon centrally in Charlton Village. The one objection received from a resident was about location not the notion of having it located centrally in the village. Overall, there was a slight preference for location C but most respondents also supported D as an alternative. Both these locations will be included in a Pre-Application to be submitted before Christmas.

Portable generator

We have been awarded a grant for a generator through the Scottish and Southern Electricity Networks' Resilient Communities Fund. This will enable the council to assist in any major incidents that occur within the parish. It will also be used during our community events.

Millennium Stone Tree

It was agreed at the last Parish Council meeting to accept the estimate for removal and stump grinding of this tree. As you can see from the pictures below the tree planted had grown considerably and was obscuring our Stone. Unfortunately it could not just be trimmed as with this type of species only the tips are green and the centre is bare.

Don't panic, the tree will be replaced at the beginning of next year, the council is looking into the right type



Charlton Leisure Centre - Community Consultation

The Leisure Centre is an important venue for the community in Charlton, Andover and surrounding villages. This highly valued green space has evolved to reflect the growing and changing needs of the community with the site offering space for multiple sports, informal recreation and play making it a 'destination site'. TVBC is about to consult over its future management/development to produce a Plan for the next 5 years and beyond.

Starting in March 2023 TVBC will work alongside the Charlton Parish Council to begin to speak with the local community to map out the use of the site, opportunities, limitations, barriers to access and challenges. It will be a comprehensive consultation involving all current and potential users with the aim of producing an approved Management Plan in Dec 2023


Warm spaces




Hampshire Sustainable Warmth Fund (SWF)

Test Valley Borough Council residents can now get help with their rising energy bills by applying for a grant of up to £25,000 for sustainable home improvements.

The grants will cover up to 100% of the costs for various energy-saving improvements such as installing insulation, heating system upgrades, energy efficient hot water solutions, solar panels and energy efficient lighting (among other improvements).

Grants range from £5,000 up to £25,000. Funding is available under this scheme for households that have a gross annual income of less than £30,000 or are in receipt of an eligible benefit. Your home

must also have an energy efficiency rating of D, E, F or G. Grants are for homeowners and those living in private rented properties. If the property is rented, then the landlord may be required to contribute towards the cost.

Letter from our Priest in Charge, Alex Randle-Bissell

Dear friends,

As we are now in the church calendar of advent there is an encouragement to feel both expectation and lament, two very different and contrasting emotions. Perhaps these feelings are very apt for this season as advent's true meaning is to remind us in a broken world of our need for God's love and saving grace. Of course, in our modern-day society that is a bit of a challenging statement and the great human problem of suffering is often accompanied with the question 'why and how would a good and loving God allow such horrible events to happen?' For many, the overwhelming notion is to simply say that it's all a load of hokum and 'religion' has been the cause of humanity's problems from the start. I have met quite a number of these folk in my time as a priest, and whilst I am always hopeful that people can change, I do think at least I know where people are coming from! Others lean towards a far more worrying trait however, and that is not thinking about it very much at all. The notion of faith for some is something to think about later on in life, or only when confronted with a serious problem that makes them stop and reflect on what it all means. With this in mind though, I am often completely baffled by the viewpoint that we are somehow in the middle of a pointless universe just passing time, and that people actually believe that life is a series of meaningless events that culminate in nothing much. Even writing that last sentence has made me feel slightly gloomy, only slightly however because for me, hope is the key in looking toward a completely different, life-changing perspective...

Thousands of years ago people had reached some of the above conclusions and had lost all hope, so God sent a rescue mission to point people back to the light and to lead them towards life as it was always meant to be. And so, in squalor, God's son was born in astonishing circumstances and went on to change everything. The rescue plan was all about the truth of love itself, that it is the most powerful human emotion we have and mixed with hope, it can endure for an eternity. There is no surprise then, that the most famous verse of the Bible is John 3: 16 – 'For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.' These are words that, in the midst of suffering, have brought hope and comfort to millions upon millions of people ever since, and continue to do so today.

As we journey through advent this year, I would invite you to reflect on a world in need, and the expectation of hope that comes with celebrating Christ being born into the world for you and for us all. I pray that you may have a very blessed Christmas.

Creating 4 Healthy Habits for Every Day!



Lots of people often ask me what they can do each day to keep healthy.

Here is a list of my 4 foundation points I introduce to my clients, by doing these 4 things everyday it will help you create great healthy habits that you can build on.

1. When standing, stand evenly with your weight distributed equally through both of your legs.
2. When sitting, sit with your weight evenly distributed through both of your sitting bones.
3. Drink water every day. To find out how much water you should be drinking each day simply divide your body weight in Kg's by 35. Eg. (70 kg ÷ 35 = 2 litres of water per day).
4. Aim to go for at least a 30 minute walk each day. (If you are new to exercise, then build up gradually, start with 5 or 10 minutes and build yourself up.






