The new gate has now been installed in the railings. It was agreed at the last Parish Council meeting that this particular green space should have a name and be semi-wild with a picnic bench and litter bin.

In line with the King's wishes for community volunteer day, a group of volunteers helped to tidy this area on 8th May. A lot of weeds were removed but

enough plants and flowers were left for the wildlife to enjoy.

The cuttings were put into a makeshift compost pile which will be properly made soon.



The council intends to plant more bulbs, to add to the bluebells that were found.

The picnic bench has been ordered and will be suitable for use by everyone.

The litter bin will be installed and emptied frequently and the railings will get a lick of paint.





We hope that this area will be a haven for wildflowers and wildlife, while being enjoyed by Charlton residents.

Therefore, a Bug Hotel has been built by a few willing volunteers.

Jubilee Beacon

The Parish Council has now paid for a Tree Protection survey, which was a requirement of Test Valley Planning. The report states that, with specific conditions, the Beacon could be placed in our preferred location. We are now awaiting formal permission before moving the Beacon from its current location in the park.

Letter from our Priest in Charge, Alex Randle-Bissell

Dear friends,

I have written many times about the nature of change and how difficult it can be for us as humans to engage with it, and yet, for all of the times that we avoid and deflect change, it is for the most part a constant part of our lives.

Here in the Pastrow Benefice we have been working for some years with the national Church on a project called 'Benefice of the Future', looking at the future of large rural benefice's and how we can be sustainable in the future - how on earth do we adapt to change and embrace new realities? – it is very hard to accept, let alone live with!

Some of you may have been engaged with a particular consultation we have been doing over the past couple of years now to simplify our governance structure and adapt to the ever-changing landscape, but also to retain and maintain the continuity of our buildings and services that we open and offer to the communities we serve. This has been a somewhat difficult and searching process, but we live with the reality that the traditional pattern of 'Church on Sunday' has been fundamentally challenged for a number of years, with less and less people choosing to come to church as society offers far more than it used to. The other significant factor is that the church is steeped in tradition, and whilst that can be a great comfort to some seeking answers to the great questions of humanity, it still needs to adapt in order to reach out to the new ways that people live their lives.

With all of this in mind, the Pastrow Benefice, or Pastrow Family of Churches as we are now known, is about to undertake a major change of governance. On the 1st June we will become a single Parish of Pastrow for all of our eleven churches, with one PCC to provide support and governance for all. We will become the largest parish in the Church of England, and I am still unsure whether that is something to marvel at or not...I suppose time will tell! Of course, there will be local church groups which still lovingly and with great care look after their local church for the benefit of our communities. For the vast majority of our parishioners, there will be no visible or tangible change – we will still be offering the same pattern of local services and people will be able to continue to give to their local church should they choose to.

I will be writing more about these changes over the next few months to give some context and detail, but in the meantime if anyone has any queries please do call me and I can provide answers and assurances as we begin this new chapter for our local churches, but we are always assured that our collective mission remains unchanged – we are here to share the love, grace and truth of Jesus Christ.

Introducing a pet into the family home can be an extremely rewarding venture especially for small children. Teaching them to care for a living creature can encourage compassion, responsibility and improve social skills whilst also boosting their immune system.

A popular choice for a child is a rabbit. They are fab pets for a small child but they have complicated housing and nutritional requirements which need to be addressed for them to have a happy and relaxed life. Rabbits should, ideally, be kept with at least one other rabbit and have a large area to move around in (3 x 2 meters floor space for 2 rabbits). The usual wooden cages are not suitable without extra outdoor space. Their digestive system requires a specific diet and regular checks on nails and their continuously growing teeth, which can cause problems needing veterinary attention. We have all heard the saying 'breeding like rabbits' so care should be taken when selecting a pair and there is the option of having them neutered.

Other choices for a child friendly pet include rats, which are super friendly, handleable and easier to look after, birds such as budgies and canaries and, with a bit of extra care, guinea pigs.




